Chinese Gang Is Suspected in Smuggling Into Dover : A Deadly Traffic in Humans

The death of 58 Chinese immigrants aboard a tomato truck at the British port of Dover was just the latest and most gruesome tip of the growing traffic in illegal immigrants by organized crime networks, European authorities said Tuesday.

The British and Dutch police on Tuesday interrogated the driver of the truck, who was detained in Dover on suspicion of manslaughter, and said they believed that one of the Chinese criminal gangs known as "snakeheads" had organized the passage of the immigrants from Fujian Province in southern China, charging an estimated £15,000 (\$22,680) a person.

Meanwhile, the police in the Dutch city of Rotterdam late Tuesday arrested another person in connection with the deaths. Prosecutors declined to name the suspect but earlier had said they were seeking an engineer, Arjen van

der Spek, 24, who had registered the truck only last week.

Two Dover survivors, in a hospital in nearby Canterbury, began telling the police about their ordeal. Speaking through interpreters, they described how the passengers had screamed and banged on the doors of the truck and how their own desperation mounted as their companions began to pass out and die, apparently of suffocation.

"This was clearly a horrific death," said a detective superintendent, Dennis McGookin.

As shocking as the incident was, there appeared to be no shortage of people prepared to run the risks in an effort to enter Europe illegally.

An estimated 500,000 people enter the 15-nation European Union illegally

each year, representing perhaps 50 percent of a global traffic in immigrants worth some \$3 billion annually for organized crime networks, according to estimates by Europol, the EU police agency.

With growing numbers of economic immigrants and political refugees from places like China, Afghanistan, the Ukraine, Moldova and Iraq offsetting a decline in immigration from the former Yugoslavia, the problem shows no sign of easing.

"This will stay on a high level," said Christian Bratz, head of Europol's illegal immigration unit.

The breadth of the problem was underscored when Spanish police announced the discovery of 36 illegal immigrants crammed into a truck on a highway in southern Spain late Monday.

BRIEF VAN DE MINISTER VAN JUSTITIE

Aan de Voorzitter van de Tweede Kamer der Staten-Generaal

Den Haag, 30 januari 2002

Op 8 december 2000 heb ik u een brief geschreven met daarin een aantal maatregelen naar aanleiding van de zogenaamde Doverzaak. Deze maatregelen waren onderverdeeld in drie thema's, te weten Doorlooptijden uitleveringsprocedure, Informatie-uitwisseling Strafrechtsketen en Communicatie en samenwerking. Graag wil ik u via deze brief op de hoogte stellen van de vorderingen die zijn gemaakt.

§ 1. Inleiding

Eén jaar na deze brief kan ik constateren dat belangrijke stappen zijn gezet. Een behoorlijk aantal van de maatregelen is uitgevoerd en andere zijn in de uitvoeringsfase. Dit betekent voor mij echter niet dat daarmee het punt van zorg weg is. Met name het kunnen en willen uitwisselen van informatie in de strafrechtsketen en het vervolmaken van de informatisering van de strafrechtsketen zijn zaken die constante aandacht en investeringen behoeven. Daarom heb ik tezamen met mijn ambtgenoot van Binnenlandse Zaken en Koninkrijksrelaties een groot aantal nadere maatregelen geformuleerd in de met uw Kamer reeds besproken nota «Criminaliteitsbeheersing, investeren in een zichtbare overheid».

Tijdens de uitwerking van de maatregelen naar aanleiding van de Doverzaak is tevens duidelijk geworden dat er veel winst is te halen uit de doorstroomsnelheid en de eenduidigheid van de strafdossiers. Dat zijn de voornaamste redenen geweest om te starten met een project dat moet leiden tot de invoering van een elektronisch proces-verbaal. In het eerste kwartaal van dit jaar zal in twee politieregio's en de twee daarbij behorende arrondissementsparketten worden gestart met een pilot elektronisch proces-verbaal op basis van artikel 8 van de Wegenverkeerswet. Daarna zal het elektronisch proces-verbaal landelijk worden geïmplementeerd en uitgebreid met meerdere feiten.

Deze brief zal verder ingaan op de genoemde hoofdthema's uit de brief van 8 december 2000.

Chinese human smugglers jailed

A Dutch court has sentenced seven members of a Chinese criminal gang to up to six years in jail for smuggling illegal immigrants into the UK from China.

Four of the suspects were charged in connection with the deaths of 58 Chinese migrants, who were found dead in a lorry in the UK town of Dover in 2000.



The 58 who died were suffocated in a lorry carrying tomatoes

The seven people convicted on Friday were among eight arrested last year in raids in Rotterdam, when 51 people were found in two safe houses awaiting transportation to Britain.

A British court had already sentenced the driver of the truck, Dutchman Perry Wacker, to 14 years in prison and a Chinese interpreter to six.

In all nine people had already been sentenced for their part in the tragedy.

False documents

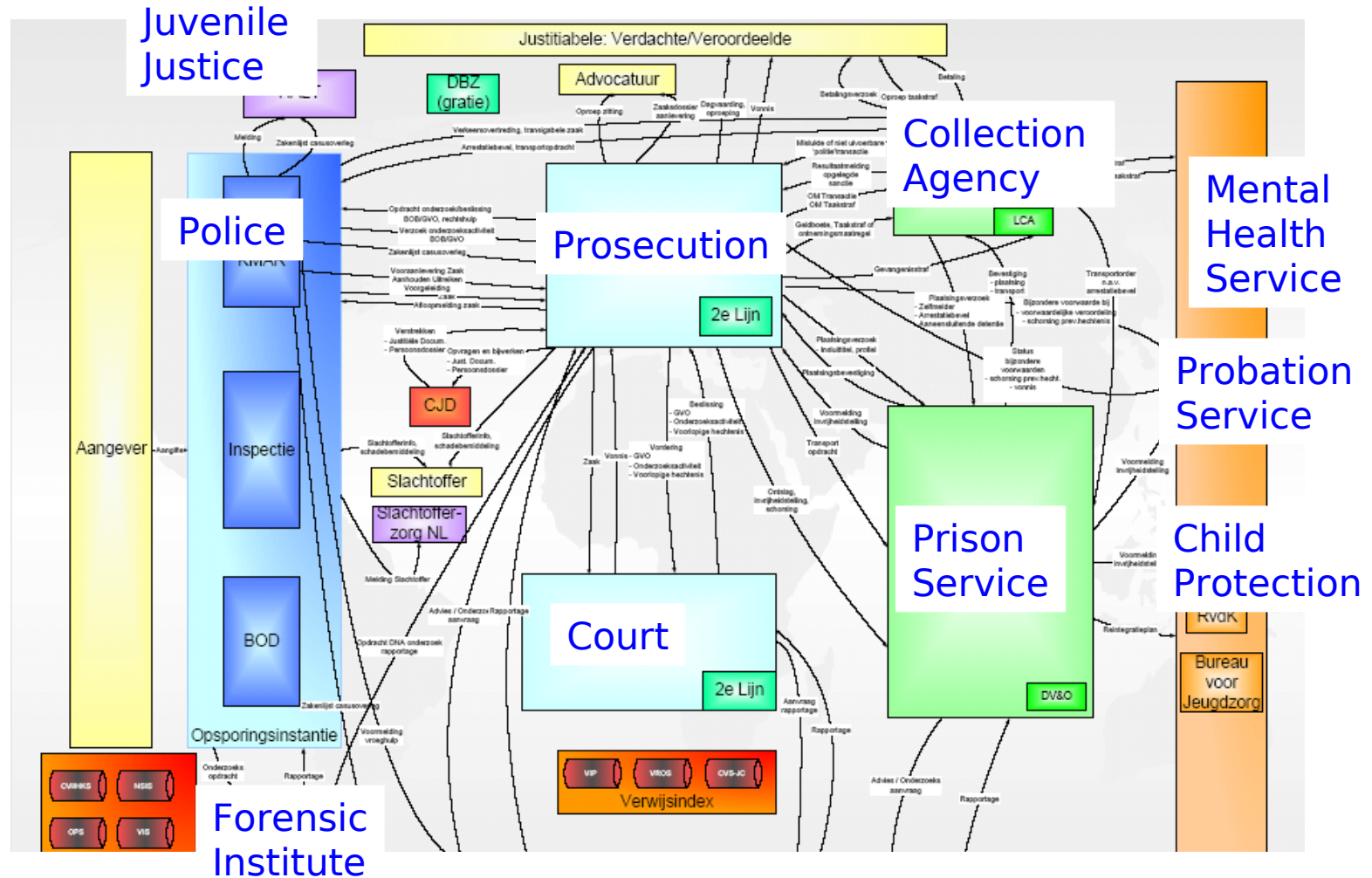
On Friday, Liu Si Yong received a six-year jail term and was fined \$25,000 for playing a leading role in a criminal organisation that was involved in the Dover tragedy.

Typology of Police cases

- Low complexity (“transactions”)
 - Traffic-related
 - Huge volumes 10.6 M cases
 - Very simple information set
 - Sanctions handled by a central collection agency
- Intermediate complexity
 - Large volumes (895 K cases)
 - Medium-size
 - 60% (ultimately handled by Prosecution/ courts)
- Complex cases
 - Small number of cases (5 K)
 - Very large dossiers (some multiple DVD-Rs)

Status

- ebMS2 profile adopted as standards in
 - Criminal Justice system (July 2005)
 - Justice (April 2005)
 - Two related communities
- Two major hubs in production (January 2006)
- A dozen organization deployments
- Two interactions in production use today
- Two dozen interactions in various stages of development/planning
 - Ranging from mere thousands to tens of millions messages per year

National e-Government Initiatives

- National registries initiatives
 - Ten core registries for citizens, businesses, buildings, topography, addresses, land registry, vehicle, income, house
- Messaging technical specification
 - Three profiles of ebMS2: non-reliable-TLS, reliable-TLS, XML security
- Proof-of-concept for Citizen Registry
 - Successfully tested software scalability of 42-90 ebMS2 messages/second (July 2006).

National Messaging Infrastructure (OSB)

- Follow-on from work on National Registries profiles
- Messaging infrastructure to connect national registries to “sector hubs” and to 450 municipalities
- Combined set of SOAP and ebMS2 profiles April 2007
- Deployment in H2 2007

Conclusion

- Demonstrated successful use of standards developed for B2B e-Commerce in a very different domain
- Adoption in some sectors moving to production
- Adoption now extending to national level
